

**Electronic Intercept Court Ordered System (EICOS) and
California Electronic Communications Privacy Act (CalECPA) training course**

Thursday, May 3, 2018 (9:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.)

****3 hours of MCLEs for the EICOS session and/or 2 hours of MCLEs for the CalECPA session****

The San Luis Obispo County District Attorney's Office is a State Bar of California approved MCLE provider.

This program qualifies for five (5) hours of MCLE credit.

California Department of Justice (DOJ) 1-day training on the EICOS system and/or CalECPA reporting requirements. This course is for EICOS coordinators and law enforcement agencies. Beverages and breakfast items will be provided for the morning session.

Training Location: California Cybersecurity Institute (CCI), Camp San Luis Obispo, 10 Sonoma Avenue, Building 631, San Luis Obispo, CA 93405. Once on base see attachment for directions to Building 631. Parking is free. A small amount of parking is available in front of BLDG 631, but there is a very large parking lot behind BLDG 631.

Requirements to Get On Base: Law Enforcement ID, Badge or be on the consolidated list provided to security.

Course Description:

EICOS - This training will provide EICOS coordinators, and others dealing with the mandatory reporting requirements of Penal Code section 629.62, the tools to comply with and accurately complete and submit the mandated forms required after completing electronic interceptions. The training will focus on issues that have arisen during each reporting year and proactive measures to decrease the impact of these issues in the future. DOJ is mandated to collect specific electronic intercept information and submit an annual report to the state Legislature, the state Judicial Council, and the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Court.

CalECPA - DOJ is also mandated by Penal Code section 1456.2 to collect and publish data on all search warrants that target a communication service provider or digital device on its public website if there is no identified target of a warrant or emergency request at the time of its issuance within 90 days of receipt. Each law enforcement agency is required to submit such data to DOJ. This training will provide law enforcement with information on the statutory requirements for a standard warrant notification, delayed warrant notification, and sealed record warrant notification without an identified target. Additional training on CalECPA requirements generally will also be provided.

Who Should Attend: Though not a mandatory training, it is highly recommended for EICOS coordinators and those who provide data to coordinators and representatives from agencies that execute search warrants.

Course Objectives: Provide important information to assist law enforcement agencies in complying with the mandated reporting requirements of Penal Code sections 629.62 and 1456.2.

Instructors: Various Deputy Attorney Generals (DAGs) involved in the reporting process.
