DISTRICT ATTORNEY DEAN D. FLIPPO EXPANDS PRE-FILING MISDEMEANOR DIVERSION PROGRAM

Monterey County District Attorney Dean Flippo announced today that his office will be expanding the existing Pre-filing Misdemeanor Diversion Program effective July 1, 2018. This program, which began on April 1, 2013, has been successful in allowing persons accused of certain low level misdemeanor offenses to complete an educational program in lieu of court prosecution. Because of this success and because of changes in the law converting certain felonies to misdemeanors, the District Attorney's Office has decided to expand the list of crimes.

The success of this program is largely due to Corrective Solutions, a private company that partners with the District Attorney's Office. Instead of being criminally charged, the accused if eligible and agree, are referred to Corrective Solutions who offer counseling, education, drug treatment, and many more rehabilitative programs that help these persons avoid poor choices in the future. Eligible persons will pay a modest fee and, upon completion, will no longer be faced with criminal prosecution.

The eligible misdemeanor offenses for the program now include the following:

Conditions of eligibility are as follows:

1. Be accused only of an eligible offense and no other violations.
2. Not have any prior felony convictions or not have two or more misdemeanor convictions.
3. Have no prior convictions or diversions for the same offense.
4. Not be on probation.
5. Not currently be in a pre-filing diversion program or be court referred to any other diversion program.
6. Not currently have any criminal charge pending.
7. Have a valid residential address or phone contact.
