Here are a few updates from last week and the week ahead.

IN THE OFFICE

New Chief of Staff

As I announced earlier this morning, we have hired **David Campos** to fill the Chief of Staff role vacated by Cristine. David has a long track record of public service and advocacy in San Francisco, including around issues of public safety and criminal justice.

David's lengthy record of successful advocacy for the most vulnerable, his ability to unite others around common goals, and his extensive legal experience makes him perfectly suited for our office and this important position. I am thrilled he is joining our team and am excited for all that we will accomplish as we push for a more just criminal legal system.

David's public service includes eight years on the Board of Supervisors as well as three years on the San Francisco Police Commission.

Since March 2017, David has served as Deputy County Executive for the County of Santa Clara. In this role, David helped establish the Division of Equity and Social Justice and has approached the county's operations through an equity lens.

In response to the COVID pandemic, David has served as Lead Public Information Officer for Santa Clara County's Emergency Operations Center, which is responsible for the County's COVID-19 response. David oversees all communications and community outreach, including in the hardest-hit communities. Under his leadership, the County developed a Community Health Worker program that conducts door-to-door outreach to prevent transmission in the Latino community and other communities.

David is also a Latino, openly gay, formerly undocumented immigrant, so he brings a unique perspective of the challenges many in our community face. I have no doubt he will be a tremendous asset to our team. David will start on October 19.

Post-Conviction Unit and Innocence Commission

Last week, we announced the launch of a SFDA Post-Conviction Unit and the formation of an Innocence Commission.

The Post-Conviction Unit will, among other work, review cases in which the sentences imposed may be excessive or where the convictions may otherwise be legally questionable. The Post-Conviction Unit attorneys will carefully consider many factors, including a defendant's prison conduct, the input of the victim(s) in the case, and a defendant's reentry plans, in determining whether to move to resent someone. When coming across cases where a conviction appears to have been wrongful, the Post-Conviction Unit will refer cases to the Innocence Commission, which will also review cases referred to it by other methods and sources.

A six-member Innocence Commission will support the work of the Post-Conviction Unit by reviewing potential wrongful convictions cases and making findings regarding innocence claims, which it will present to me. The Innocence Commission will be led by **Professor Lara Bazelon**, Director of the Criminal & Juvenile Justice and Racial Justice Clinics at University of San Francisco Law School. Also serving on the Commission are the **Honorable Judge LaDoris Cordell (Ret.)**; medical expert **Dr. George Wood**; Executive Director of the Northern California Innocence Project **Linda Starr**; San Francisco Managing District Attorney **Arcelia Hurtado**; and San Francisco Deputy Public Defender **Jacque Wilson**.

Promoting justice in our legal system requires us not only to move forward but also to look backward. When someone has been wrongly convicted, it is incumbent upon prosecutors to correct that injustice.

Victim assistance program for merchants

Yesterday, I joined Supervisor Dean Preston to announce a partnership between our offices to spearhead a first-of-its-kind victim assistance program for small neighborhood businesses located in District 5. The program will utilize grants to offset the costs of smashed windows for eligible small businesses.

Under the pilot program, businesses can be reimbursed up to \$1,000 of the cost of replacing a storefront window, with a maximum of two reimbursements per year. The program is retroactive; businesses are eligible for reimbursements for the costs of repairing broken windows for incidents that occurred on or after March 17, 2020, the start of Shelter in Place.

Victim assistance is a crucial component of our work. In California, we have vital programs to assist victims of violent crime, but no state funding to help victims of property crimes, leaving those victims to shoulder the costs. This program will help alleviate some of that burden and provide victim assistance to small businesses.

Good morning -

I've also posted this to the PC745/AB 2542 community and administrators community, hoping to garnish more input.

We've continued to consult with an outside agency (UC Berkley Policy Lab), thinking that we may want to have them take a look at our data as was suggested in the December training on PC745. We would want them to evaluate our data from Karpel, and analyze what happens to racial disparities at each given decision-making point in the life of a case. For example, what were the racial demographics of all PC211 referrals we received from 2017 to 2020? What were the demographics at filing stage? Dispo stage? Sentencing stage? Of course, we hope the result will be that any racial disparities remain relatively stable, or perhaps narrow. If not, then it is a great way for us to focus on those areas and increase training and other mitigation measures.

One concern we have is, even if we enter into an MOU/DUA with the Lab that requires confidentiality on their part, would it be subject to a PRA on our end? And even if the resulting report we get from the Lab is protected, wouldn't our raw data still be subject to a PRA? Wouldn't the data be subject to a PRA anyway, even if we never shared it with an outside agency or consultant? If so, it seems that the raw data would be (potentially) good evidence for the defense to rely on to establish a prima facie showing under PC 745. If it is subject to a PRA anyway, I think we would probably want an outside agency to help us analyze it in anticipation of a defense to PC745.

We still have not seen a PC745 motion in our county, and I haven't seen anything new here in quite awhile. I was hoping to get an update if anyone has one, as to what your offices are doing. I know some offices have decided not to do anything proactive, but to simply respond to motions if and when they come in, using your own internal data and department analyst. Perhaps that is the wiser route? Thoughts? Now would be the ideal time for a live, in-person training so we could roundtable! Here's hoping, for later this year.

Hello, it was brought to my attention that PC1203.9, transfer of cases and jurisdiction, has been amended effective July 1, 2021. I spoke with my probation department since it's the entity in my county that collects restitution for its interpretation of the statute. They agreed that the transferring court retains jurisdiction over restitution and all financial aspects of the case. The receiving court retains jurisdiction over everything else but can no longer add its fees effective July 1, 2021. See PC1203.9

I contacted my office's chief deputies for legislative updates and have attached the following information from CDAA and the Alameda County DA's Office. Has anyone received guidance from your respective offices on the transfer of cases? If so, please share.







Before I forward to Chesa with recommendations about letters of support, I wanted to check in with you on the following three bills;

SB 300	Cortese	Crimes: murder: punishment.	Sen. Pub Safety - no hearing date	Reforms California's felony murder special circumstances law and ensure that the death penalty and life without the possibility of parole cannot be imposed on those who did not kill, nor intend that a person die, during a crime.
AB 256	Kalra	Criminal procedure: discrimination.	Asm Public Safety 3/23	Makes the Racial Justice Act retroactive.
AB 124	Kamlager	Sentencing.	Asm. Pub Safety 4/6 likely hearing date	Second Opportunity Sentencing (S.O.S.) would create a clear path to request a reduced prison sentence in cases where the defendant's victimization was a "significant contributing factor" to their criminal behavior. The bill language will likely change a lot before it gets to the floor.

Hyper links for all of the bills are included above. AB 124 I am inclined to say support. It will ultimately need to be reconciled with our resentencing bill if both pass but the bills are not in conflict. Not clear on the other two- AB 300, I have no expertise on and AB 256 I could imagine us potentially having recommendations on amendments. Happy to handle via email or set up a time for us to meet. Whatever is most helpful.

I am including the following documents for consideration as we explore the implementation of the Racial Justice Act;

- Summary of the racial disparity analysis conducted by UPenn and UCB.
- A 2013 memo on Race and Ethnicity info amongst SF CJ Agencies.
- CJ Race Data Flow Chart.

Key takeaways from these documents:

- We (SFDA) do not create race and ethnicity data on the criminal division side this field is populated by CMS data.
- Victim Services Division does track demographic information via self-report from victim/survivors.
- While we do receive perceived race of victim and suspect as documented by law enforcement in police reports this is not currently stored in DAMION in a searchable or extractable way.
- JMS(Sheriff Case management system) is what I would consider the “source of truth” for race and ethnicity data in the CJ system. Unfortunately this data is corrupted when filtered through CMS. Good data becomes bad data. CMS feeds into DAMION so we get the bad data.
- We do receive on an adhoc basis race and ethnicity data from JMS/Sheriff. We use this for research projects and Safety and Justice Challenge related work.

The following remedies shall be imposed if a violation is found by the preponderance of the evidence:

(1) When there **has not been a final conviction, the court may reseal** a juror removed by use of a peremptory challenge, declare a mistrial, **discharge the jury panel** and empanel a new jury, or **dismiss or reduce charges**. Monetary sanctions and training alone are not sufficient as a remedy.

(2) (A) When there has been a final conviction or sentence, if the court finds that a conviction was sought or obtained in violation of subdivision (a), **the court shall vacate the conviction and sentence, find that it is legally invalid, and remand the case for new proceedings** consistent with subdivision (a).

(B) When there has been a final conviction or sentence, if the court finds that only the sentence was sought, obtained, or imposed in violation of subdivision (a), the court shall vacate the sentence, find that it is **legally invalid, and remand the case for resentencing** consistent with subdivision (a). On remand, the court shall not impose a new sentence greater than that previously imposed.

(3) When the court finds there has been a violation of subdivision (a), **the defendant shall not be eligible for the death penalty.**

- (f) This section also applies to commitments in the juvenile justice system.
- (g) This section shall not prevent the prosecution of hate crimes pursuant to Sections 422.6 to 422.865, inclusive.

Similarly situated people language is inferred through this definition.

(h) As used in this section, the following definitions apply:

(1) “More frequently sought or obtained” or “more frequently imposed” means that statistical evidence or aggregate data demonstrate a significant difference in seeking or obtaining convictions or in imposing sentences and **the prosecution cannot establish race-neutral reasons for the disparity.**

The following remedies shall be imposed if a violation is found by the preponderance of the evidence:

(1) When there **has not been a final conviction, the court may reseal** a juror removed by use of a peremptory challenge, **declare a mistrial, discharge the jury panel** and empanel a new jury, or **dismiss or reduce charges**. Monetary sanctions and training alone are not sufficient as a remedy.

(2) (A) When there has been a final conviction or sentence, if the court finds that a conviction was sought or obtained in violation of subdivision (a), **the court shall vacate the conviction and sentence, find that it is legally invalid, and remand the case for new proceedings** consistent with subdivision (a).

(B) When there has been a final conviction or sentence, if the court finds that only the sentence was sought, obtained, or imposed in violation of subdivision (a), the court shall vacate the sentence, find that it is **legally invalid, and remand the case for resentencing** consistent with subdivision (a). On remand, the court shall not impose a new sentence greater than that previously imposed.

(3) When the court finds there has been a violation of subdivision (a), **the defendant shall not be eligible for the death penalty.**

(f) This section also applies to commitments in the juvenile justice system.

(g) This section shall not prevent the prosecution of hate crimes pursuant to Sections 422.6 to 422.865, inclusive.

Similarly situated people language is inferred through this definition.

(h) As used in this section, the following definitions apply:

(1) "More frequently sought or obtained" or "more frequently imposed" means that statistical evidence or aggregate data demonstrate a significant difference in seeking or obtaining convictions or in imposing sentences and **the prosecution cannot establish race-neutral reasons for the disparity.**

We had a few ideas and questions that I'd like to get your feedback on. We were talking with Victoria about the importance of identifying a core group of CJREW members to the success of the RJA training, visioning and goal setting processes with Marisa Arona, and overall success of the CJREW. We were naming the need to identify the 5-8 consistent and engaged members and be sure to prioritize their participation and uplift their leadership roles in the trainings. Victoria agreed to get us a list of those core members and their titles/positions within their respective agencies. Hello Tara,

I hope you are well. I am following up on the Batson reform bill, AB 3070 (Weber). I understood from our call that Cristine and your team have concerns about the section of the bill that makes presumptively invalid reasons for striking a juror based on demeanor, "unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior."

As background, that part of the bill was originally drafted based on the language in GR 37, and to read like this:

(f) (1) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in (f)(2), that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

(2) The following reasons have historically been associated with improper

discrimination in jury selection in California:

(A) allegations that the prospective juror was sleeping, inattentive, or staring or failing to make eye contact;

(B) exhibited a problematic attitude, body language, or demeanor; and

(C) provided unintelligent or confused answers.

The staff for Judiciary Committee reorganized the bill to place these reasons in the same section with the other presumptively invalid reasons and added the current notice and opportunity to remedy language. We agree it's not very clear.

Our idea for a solution is to strike "unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior" and add instead:

(f) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in subdivision (e) 13, 14, or 15, that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

This tracks the GR 37 language – although I'll say, we are not sure if "and addresses" really makes sense or is necessary.

We would love your feedback on this and also to see if other changes would be needed for the SF DA to support the bill.

I have attached a mock up showing this proposed change and also an amendment in the remedy section requested by the California Employment Lawyers Association, making clear that a mistrial will only be granted if requested by the moving party, which is current law.

I hope you are well. I am following up on the Batson reform bill, AB 3070 (Weber). I understood from our call that Cristine and your team have concerns about the section of the bill that makes presumptively invalid reasons for striking a juror based on demeanor, “unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior.”

As background, that part of the bill was originally drafted based on the language in GR 37, and to read like this:

(f) (1) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in (f)(2), that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

(2) The following reasons have historically been associated with improper discrimination in jury selection in California:

(A) allegations that the prospective juror was sleeping, inattentive, or staring or failing to make eye contact;

(B) exhibited a problematic attitude, body language, or demeanor; and

(C) provided unintelligent or confused answers.

The staff for Judiciary Committee reorganized the bill to place these reasons in the same section with the other presumptively invalid reasons and added the current notice and opportunity to remedy language. We agree it's not very clear.

Our idea for a solution is to strike “unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior” and add instead:

(f) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in subdivision (e) 13, 14, or 15, that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel

verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

This tracks the GR 37 language – although I’ll say, we are not sure if “and addresses” really makes sense or is necessary.

We would love your feedback on this and also to see if other changes would be needed for the SF DA to support the bill.

I have attached a mock up showing this proposed change and also an amendment in the remedy section requested by the California Employment Lawyers Association, making clear that a mistrial will only be granted if requested by the moving party, which is current law.

(f) (1) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in (f)(2), that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

(2) The following reasons have historically been associated with improper discrimination in jury selection in California:

(A) allegations that the prospective juror was sleeping, inattentive, or staring or failing to make eye contact;

(B) exhibited a problematic attitude, body language, or demeanor; and

(C) provided unintelligent or confused answers.

The staff for Judiciary Committee reorganized the bill to place these reasons in the same section with the other presumptively invalid reasons and added the current notice and opportunity to remedy language. We agree it's not very clear.

Our idea for a solution is to strike “unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior” and add instead:

(f) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in subdivision (e) 13, 14, or 15, that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

This tracks the GR 37 language – although I’ll say, we are not sure if “and addresses” really makes sense or is necessary.

I understood from our call that Cristine and your team have concerns about the section of the bill that makes presumptively invalid reasons for striking a juror based on demeanor, "unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior."

As background, that part of the bill was originally drafted based on the language in GR 37, and to read like this:

(f) (1) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in (f)(2), that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

(2) The following reasons have historically been associated with improper discrimination in jury selection in California:

(A) allegations that the prospective juror was sleeping, inattentive, or staring or failing to make eye contact;

(B) exhibited a problematic attitude, body language, or demeanor; and

(C) provided unintelligent or confused answers.

The staff for Judiciary Committee reorganized the bill to place these reasons in the same section with the other presumptively invalid reasons and added the current notice and opportunity to remedy language. We agree it's not very clear.

Our idea for a solution is to strike "unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior" and add instead:

(f) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in subdivision (e) 13, 14, or 15, that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

This tracks the GR 37 language – although I'll say, we are not sure if "and addresses" really makes sense or is necessary.

We would love your feedback on this and also to see if other changes would be needed for the SF DA to support the bill.

I have attached a mock up showing this proposed change and also an amendment in the remedy section requested by the California Employment Lawyers Association, making clear that a mistrial will only be granted if requested by the moving party, which is current law.

- In subsection (f), we will change "corroboration" to "finding" and take out "opposing counsel." We also decided to remove "and addressed" in that subsection.

Here's what we are not able to do at this time:

- Change the standard in (e) from clear and convincing to preponderance. We are open to continued discussions on this but would like to get it through the Assembly with the higher standard for now.
- Change "shall" to "may" in the two places you flagged. We are concerned that creates ambiguity about whether the judge should impose a sanction and when, and that it will raise concerns with judiciary committee staff.

Hello Tara,

I hope you are well. I am following up on the Batson reform bill, AB 3070 (Weber). I understood from our call that Cristine and your team have concerns about the section of the bill that makes presumptively invalid reasons for striking a juror based on demeanor, "unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior."

As background, that part of the bill was originally drafted based on the language in GR 37, and to read like this:

(f) (1) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in (f)(2), that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

(2) The following reasons have historically been associated with improper discrimination in jury selection in California:

(A) allegations that the prospective juror was sleeping, inattentive, or staring or failing to make eye contact;

(B) exhibited a problematic attitude, body language, or demeanor; and

(C) provided unintelligent or confused answers.

The staff for Judiciary Committee reorganized the bill to place these reasons in the same section with the other presumptively invalid reasons and added the current notice and opportunity to remedy language. We agree it's not very clear.

Our idea for a solution is to strike "unless reasonable notice was provided to remedy the behavior" and add instead:

(f) If any party intends to strike a juror for one of the reasons listed in subdivision (e) 13, 14, or 15, that party must provide reasonable notice to the court and the other parties so the behavior can be verified and addressed in a timely manner. A lack of corroboration by the judge or opposing counsel verifying the behavior shall invalidate the given reason for the peremptory challenge.

This tracks the GR 37 language – although I'll say, we are not sure if "and addresses" really makes sense or is necessary.

We would love your feedback on this and also to see if other changes would be needed for the SF DA to support the bill.

I have attached a mock up showing this proposed change and also an amendment in the remedy section requested by the California Employment Lawyers Association, making clear that a mistrial will only be granted if requested by the moving party, which is current law.

Pub Safety - no hearing date	Reforms California's felony murder special circumstances law and ensure that the death penalty and life without the possibility of parole cannot be imposed on those who did not kill, nor intend that a person die, during a crime.
AB 256	Kalra	Criminal procedure: discrimination.	Asm Public Safety 3/23	Makes the Racial Justice Act retroactive.
AB 124	Kamlager	Sentencing.	Asm. Pub Safety 4/6 likely hearing date	Second Opportunity Sentencing (S.O.S.) would create a clear path to request a reduced prison sentence in cases where the defendant's victimization was a "significant contributing factor" to their criminal behavior. The bill language will likely change a lot before it gets to the floor.

Hyper links for all of the bills are included above. AB 124 I am inclined to say support. It will ultimately need to be reconciled with our resentencing bill if both pass but the bills are not in conflict. Not clear on the other two- AB 300, I have no expertise on and AB 256 I could imagine us potentially having recommendations on amendments. Happy to handle via email or set up a time for us to meet. 
