

COVID-19 cases are starting to climb again across much of the U.S. But infectious disease experts in the Bay Area say the Golden State may be well positioned to avoid another surge. ••• Will California's expanded vaccine eligibility crowd out the people who need shots most? ••• A San Jose vaccination clinic is getting musical accompaniment.


