defendant's good cause showing of plausible justification under Racial Justice Act for discovery relevant to a potential violation of Act is merely a threshold consideration, and a trial court, in deciding discovery motion, must consider and balance whether: (1) requested material is adequately described, (2) requested material is reasonably available to governmental entity from which it is sought and not otherwise readily available to defendant, (3) production of records containing requested

material would violate third party confidentiality or privacy rights or any protected governmental interest, (4) defendant acted in timely manner, (5) time required to produce material will necessitate an unreasonable delay of trial, and (6) production of records would place an unreasonable burden on government. 




